What Is Community Shared Agriculture?

A direct, local, organic food distribution system. It has arisen in response to rapid industrialization and environmental contamination of the food supply in our country. It is a **connection** between a nearby farmer and the people who eat the food that the farmer produces. It is a movement that acknowledges a long-ignored reality: most of what we pay for our food goes to companies that transport, process, and market what comes off the farm, not to farmers themselves.

In the United States today, this connection has been broken. Food comes from stores and restaurants and vending machines. It has been washed, processed, packaged, maybe even irradiated, and transported long distances. CSA offers one of the most hopeful alternatives to this downward spiral, and it is the only model of farming in which customers consciously agree to share the risks and benefits with the farmers. In the CSA model, farmers are supported by voluntary communities of eaters organized to pay growers directly for what they produce. Bypassing the supermarket, the middlemen, and the international transportation system, CSA members receive fresh local produce in season, at reasonable prices.

Power of Love Community Shared Agriculture members pay the **LOWEST PRICE** by committing **IN ADVANCE** with varying degrees of financial commitment. Members receive a 20lb (minimum) box of assorted fresh produce weekly, dropped off at arranged locations in the local community. The farm box may include fruit, vegetables, and herbs.

The financial commitment /share price for the 2010 season is

20 week commitment weekly pay \$20.00 (June- October)
16 week commitment weekly pay \$22.00 (July – October)
No commitment weekly pay \$25.00 (contact your neighborhood coordinator)

A share represents a minimum of four types of produce from the weekly harvest. We will be planting in 2010 potatoes, sweet potatoes, squash, zucchini, tomatoes, sweet corn, cabbage, string beans, cantaloupe, watermelon, cucumbers, sweet peas, collard greens, kale, broccoli, bell peppers, cayenne, peaches, onions, beets, apples, strawberries, romaine, okra, and eggplant.

We also offer an herb package add in thyme, basil, parsley, cilantro, mint, dill for \$2.00 additional weekly. For cat lovers we have catnip!!
